In recent months, who among us hasn't longed for a return to "the good old days;" you know, those pre-Covid-19 days? Reflecting on the many changes we've gone through since the beginning of March, I've been reminded of these words penned by King David in Psalm 139: Your eyes saw me when I was formless; all my days were written in your book and planned before a single one of them began. Psalm 139:16. King David reminds us that all the days of our life—past, present, and future, were written in the Lord's book before a single one of them came to pass.

To be sure, in the midst of this pandemic, it is tempting to long for the comforts of the past; one of those comforts being a sense of normalcy. In his book, *The Primitive Liturgy* published in 1726, author Rev. John Henley, dedicated his book, in part, "to all admirers of the Good Old Days, of their Best and Wisest Forefathers."

Oftentimes we find it difficult to get over our longing for the comforts of the past. We make the assumption that the future, about which we know nothing, surely will not be as good as the past, about which we know everything. But wait—shouldn't we, as those who look to the Lord, have confidence that the future, regardless of what it holds, can be trusted? In the good old days, our Young Adult LifeGroup began a study of Revelation. We have continued to meet each week via Facebook Messenger. We're not at the end yet, but looking forward, we will encounter these words: Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away. Revelation 21:1. The Bible teaches that our eternal destiny is earthly. As Peter wrote, But based on his promise, we wait for new heavens and a new earth, where righteousness dwells. 2 Peter 3:13

Think about that—for the child of God the future holds a new earth, full of righteousness in which pain and sorrow will be absent.

Yes, the days of our lives—past, present and future are written in God's book. And as David Jeremiah noted of those days, none are better than others because they are all in the hands of God.

A famous anonymous quote goes something like this: we may not know what the future holds, but we know Who holds the future. Let's put aside any notion of dwelling on the good old days and put our focus on Him Who holds the glorious future that awaits.
